The minor in health care management provides students with a foundational understanding of healthcare systems and employment options in this exciting and growing field. The business of healthcare is everywhere: insurance companies, hospitals, clinical practices, branding firms, pharmaceuticals and medical devices. Regardless of the student's career focus, this minor expands their understanding of the language of healthcare systems and enhances job prospects in the healthcare industry. Students learn how healthcare systems are managed, the ways in which healthcare relies on analytics, and the influence of government policies on the business of healthcare. Additionally, students may customize their studies with coursework in finance, analytics, supply chain, or entrepreneurship and strategy.
